Position to be filled: Mental Health Counselor

Required Qualifications/Essential Duties:

- Graduation from an accredited college or university with a Master's Degree in Social work or another source of study acceptable to the state of California Board of Behavioral Science.
- Valid Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LCSW), or Licensed Marriage and Family Therapist (MFT). Licensed issued by the state of California, Department of Consumer Affairs, Board of Behavioral Science. 2 years' experience with licensure. Experience working within the Native American community. Cultural competency theory practice and its application.
- Assist Tribal Social Services Director and other Tribal Social Services, staff.
- Update case status reports daily and proved weekly reports and specialized reports as needed.
- Practice the Tachi-Yokut culture, and established Tribal/Departmental policy and procedures.
- Maintain a caseload

Reports to:

- Maintain the knowledge and practice of Substance Abuse Treatment. SRR adapts and abides by local, state, and federal laws to provide services.
- Maintain knowledge and practice of Mental Health Treatment modalities per local, state, and federal practices.
- Abide by Therapeutic ethical code of conduct.
- Maintain client/tribal member records according to HIPPA and 42 CFR. Adheres to all confidentiality standards.
- Knowledge of appropriate techniques, methods, and practice working with Native Americans.
- Knowledge of strategies for effectively working with at-risk youth, substance abuse disorder (Co-Occurring,) family, and couple therapy.
- Evaluate clients and formulate a treatment plan.
- Work with a multi-disciplinary team.
- Provide crisis intervention services.
- Maintain Department case files and contact notes per the departmental guidelines.
- Ensures appropriate and comprehensive documentation within an EHR system.
- Complete appropriate documentation requesting per-diem for travel when necessary.
- Assess clients who are referred by outside agencies such as probation, CPS, and or parole.
- Conduct individual sessions and groups.
- Work with the community, public or private resources, and other organizations as appropriate in the delivery of client services.
- Stay current with counseling practices, modalities, and certifications by attending the necessary trainings, workshops, and submitting a request for certification or re-certification as needed.
- Prepare court report promptly if needed. May attend court hearings as needed at the director's discretion.
- Perform other work-related duties, as assigned.
